Devotions

Graham brought the devotions from Exodus 33: 1:17

“For some of us this is a familiar story, but for me it has been good to read it again and to reflect on it. We often (and I include myself in this), think that we can just trot into God’s presence, say ‘Bless you Lord’ raise our hands, shout ‘Alleluia’, we go home and we get on with life. God says, ‘If you really want to find my favour, if you really want to see my glory then it will take more than that. Moses spent time to meet with God, to seek Him. He had a tent put up, a place where he could go and he would set himself aside from leading a million people or so, through some pretty hostile country where everybody was looking to put them down, where there was very little water, food was very scarce and there were lots of demands on Moses. Yet he knew that the most important thing for him to do was to set up a place where he could go and spend time talking and having a friendship discussion with the Lord God, Yahweh. He found time to be with Him, in the business of all the demands of his people. He saw that it was important to spend time with God. Joshua, his assistant never left the tent. Joshua was the guy who took over from Moses, because Moses modelled to Joshua the importance of spending time, face to face with God. Joshua copied that and he didn't leave the tent. Every time they moved on and then God would say to stay here for a time. They would pitch the tent and Joshua would return to it to spend time with God, because he wanted to meet with God, to know Him, because Moses had modelled that for him. He could see how important that was. And then, because God was so hacked off with the people of Israel He sent an angel. You will still have the victory. You will win. You will still inherit the land. You will still see victory, but I am not coming with you. Moses went, well hang on a minute, that might me all very well and good. Moses had such a relationship with God that he said unless you came with I aint going. I'm staying here, because winning victories, winning the land, seeing people set free and released is not what it's about. It is about knowing the presence of God, and having His presence with us. God agreed for His presence to go with them. He said I will do the very thing you've asked, because I am pleased with you and I know you by name. He was still hacked off with the people of Israel, but He said to Moses, because I know you, because I know what your heart desires, because I know your desires, with full energy and intent and purpose. Because of you My presence will be with you.

For us there are lessons which perhaps we need to reflect on, because so much of what we have been trying to bring in the preaching on a Sunday is that its God's presence that's important, seeking after Him. It's really design His presence. As Moses said, unless Your presence is with us then nothing will set us apart as Your people, and if God's presence isn't with us as His church then we are no different to the social club up the road. We can do all sorts of social things, meet and greet, working our fingers to the bone and helping people and support, befriend and encourage them, but if God's presence is not with us in transforming and changing lives then we are no different to the social clubs. We need to have a guard on our words and attitudes. The people of Israel were very good at grumbling and complaining. Leaders are not infallible. We might like to think we are, but we are not. Forgive us for perhaps when we come over like that. We are just trying to struggle along with God, in the same way that you are probably struggling along. Support and encourage one another, don't grumble and moan. If you've got a grumble and a moan, go and talk to the person you've got the grumble and moan with, not with the person who's got a sympathetic ear. Let's keep our focus on seeking and worshiping God, not on other things of this world. The children of Israel, when Moses was away getting the ten commandments, they couldn't wait for Moses to come back. They made a golden calf and sacrificed and worshipped that and in the end that was ground up and they were made to drink the golden calf. That's why God says that we are not going to see His form, because once we do we will try to make an image like it. Making time for God should be our priority as God's people. We need to get close to God, like Moses and Joshua did, like many others in the bible did, that we read about and celebrate. We say, didn't they have a great relationship with God. Didn't God do marvellous things through them. It was because they knew God and spoke with Him. Cultivate in your hearts and minds a longing to speak with God face to face as with a friend. You might say, hang on a minute, in the bible it says that if people see My face they will die. I don't think that's a physical death, but it may be, but it's when we encounter God in that real face to face way, that something that is inside us that is rebellious, obstinate, difficult, is unholy will die. And we might come alive with the Holy Spirit. That's a brilliant exchange. Together we need to seek God's favour, God's presence and His glory. Let's not settle for second best. Succeeding without God's presence is only a failure. That passage actually goes on. Moses has had that conversation with God and says now show me Your glory, show me Your glory. He had been speaking with God face to face and there were times when he had to cover his face with a veil because of the presence of God, but Moses was still not satisfied and he said show me Your glory. My prayer for us as church, and the leaders prayer is for us as church, now show us Your glory".

There then followed a time of prayer

Elders Report and New Minister Update: Graham

The Tuesday evening prayer meeting has been a great source of encouragement as between 11 and 18 people have been involved. The focus has been and will continue to be for God's Kingdom to come on us and the area of Bentley and then beyond.

God answers prayer when we pray in accordance with His will. As we pray we sense His leading as to how we should pray and for what we should pray. He shares his heart with us as we seek Him and His ways.

On 5th May nineteen people went on to the streets and prayer walked the area around renew127. We propose we go again on Saturday 7th July, spreading the area wider covering different streets. Let us all continue to pray as Jesus taught his disciples, "Your Kingdom come, Your will be done on earth as in heaven".

Jesus came to seek and to save the lost. He commanded his disciples to "make disciples, baptising them in his name and teaching them to obey everything he commanded them". We want to reaffirm the church's vision 'To make disciples who make disciples'. We do this by witnessing to the love and goodness of God shown to us in Jesus.

First we 'Win' through loving others and sharing with them our experience of God's love to us. Unless we witness to God's love and power in our lives to win others for Christ, the next steps do not happen.

Then we 'Consolidate'. Take them through a basic discipling course so they understand who they are now in Christ.

We then 'Disciple'. Long term committed mentoring. Helping them grow in maturity in their faith.

We 'Send'. Encouraging them, through our example, to witness to God's love experience in their lives. This starts the process again.

As we seek to follow God's plan for His church here, we continue to seek for His anointed person, whom He has called to lead us into the fullness of His blessing. We had six applicants following the advert for new minister/leader, however none were seen to have God's hand upon them for this role with us. The leaders have met with Graham Ensor and Mary Taylor, YBA regional ministers, they are also prayerfully seeking who may be suitable for us. They have passed on one person whom we contacted but they were already in discussion with two other churches.

We need to keep focussed on what God is saying and how he is leading us. A prophetic word was spoken to us during the Fresh Streams conference in January. "God says I don't need a minister to talk to, I want to talk directly to the church as a whole". 'So each one of us needs to be listening to what God may be saying. There was also a picture of the throne of God, with gentleness and beauty coming from the throne, first to the church then flowing out to the town or village around. Clear the debris and plant flowers first, then plant trees'.

Our challenge and responsibility is to seek God's face and deepen our relationship with Him. Unless His presence goes with us and directs us we have nothing to offer which is life changing. So let us follow in the way He leads us, let us encourage one another in this.

Graham explained in answer to a questions that the applications for the position of Minister were either rejected due to a lack of experience or the fact that for the others the Elders had felt no word from God that they had a calling to minister at Bentley on their lives. He went on to explain that this was not a process to be rushed into and that it was important that we wait for the right person in God's eyes. It may be later that we consider re advertising again, but we are waiting on God as we consider future actions.

Dave Miller reiterated the importance of Gods hand in the process and said that the those that applied had not been exciting. When it is right it will be like pieces of a jigsaw coming together. We are confident in the fact that this is His church and He will speak quite clearly when the right time and the right person is there.
