Devotions

We urge you, brothers and sisters, warn those who are idle and disruptive, encourage the disheartened, help the weak, be patient with everyone. Make sure that nobody pays back wrong for wrong, but always strive to do what is good for each other and for everyone else. Rejoice always, pray continually, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus.

August is almost upon us, thoughts focus on a well-earned rest, a holiday, relaxing. Why not it has been a busy and exciting seven months as we have seen God at work in our midst. Reading the 1 Thessalonians passage in The Passion Translation has given me a different approach to rest.

We appeal to you, dear brothers and sisters, to instruct those who are not in their place of battle. *Be skilled at* gently encouraging those who feel themselves inadequate. *Be faithful* to stand your ground. Help the weak to stand again. *Be quick to* demonstrate patience with everyone. The Greek word *ataktos* is often used for troops that are not in battle formation (unarranged). (NIV) Idle and disruptive. (TPT) not in their place of battle.

The enemy the devil prowls round like a roaring lion seeking someone to devour. 1 Peter 5: 8 The devil never takes a holiday. We must be battle ready, always. Put your armour on each day. Then live each day in this way. "*Be skilled at* gently encouraging those who feel themselves inadequate. *Be faithful* to stand your ground. Help the weak to stand again. *Be quick to* demonstrate patience with everyone. Resist revenge, and make sure that no one pays back evil in place of evil but always pursue doing what is beautiful to one another and to all *the unbelievers*.

Let joy be your continual feast. ¹⁷ Make your life a prayer. And in the midst of everything be always giving thanks, for this is God's perfect plan for you in Christ Jesus." Let us be ready for battle with the enemy. Let's seek to put God's perfect plan into place, because we want to put the enemy, Satan, who is prowling around, in his place. Elders Report and New Minister Update: Graham

It has been great encouragement to hear testimonies of God's healing and ongoing blessing in our church family life, may this continue in greater measure as we move forward into all God has for us in the coming months.

There were eighteen people who went to the Well Church Sheffield for the Naturally Supernatural course. As we seek to live out what we have learned and experienced as we step out in faith there will be many challenges and we pray opportunities to see God touch lives with his love and power and many come to know Jesus as Lord and Saviour.

On Saturday 7th July we again prayer walked, this time around the church and the park. We spent some time in the park praying for the Bonanza, the church's presence and witness and for New Visions and their music presentation of faith and hope in Jesus.

What a great encouragement for the church when the God inspired outreach of buns and questionnaire was put forward by Catherine and Lorraine. With Lorraine's Life Group prepared to develop the idea, prepare the questionnaire and publicity. With the support of the church, 69 questionnaires were completed, good conversations had and most of the buns given away. Thank you to everyone who got involved to help make this happen. Please pray for ongoing wisdom and inspiration as the needs and desires of the people talked to are analysed and how to follow up. We now have some of the feedback and one of the interesting remarks, was perhaps unsurprising.

How many had little interest in church. We need to pray about how we introduce these people to Jesus.

As we look forward through August we must not lose sight that we are always witnesses to God's love and mercy. Let us pray and encourage those who will be leading the services.

In September we will be prayer walking again and have the opportunity to learn about personal evangelism. Please make a note of the dates so you can keep them free.

Regarding a new full time leader/minister we have had a conference call with someone in Scotland but this was not God's person for us. Other people have been submitted from the YBA, again none were felt to be God's appointment for us. Further contact with Adrian, who preached at the end of May, has been made with regard to the elders meeting him and getting to know him better.

Please keep praying that we will know the way forward in all matters to do with the Kingdom of God. Let us continue to take steps of faith as we reach out to the lost we meet every day and to the community around the church. Showing God's love is rewarding and can be tiring but insignificant when we see what God did out of love for us.
