The DBS register will be updated in the next few months. It is suggested that DBS checks are renewed approximately every 3 years. So those working with children/adults may be asked to complete an application form to apply for a new DBS check. BBC will be applying for DBS checks for everyone working with children/adults even if they have a current DBS certificate through another organisation. This is to ensure that church is up to date with all safe guarding recommendations.

CCPAS (The Churches' Child Protection Advisory Service) have recently advertised safe guarding training but it was not in this area. I will be making enquiries about future safe guarding training in this area.

Website and Social Media

It's been just over 12 months since I took on the church website and social media and it has been quite the learning curve!

**Website** – the first job I felt I should do on the website was a change in colour scheme and a slight change in the layout, I felt that the website needed to have a professional and modern feel while still staying friendly and inviting. I took inspiration for the colour scheme from the colours of the church décor and added in grey to compliment.

My second task was to go through every individual page and make sure all information was up to date. This has been quite a long process and I am aware that some pages still aren't fully up to date as I am waiting to be sent additional information for them. The pages for the community work e.g. renew, open the book, football etc. I would like to perhaps feel a little bit more personal so maybe if you are involved in one of these you could give me some suggestions on how to achieve this? I just feel these pages could share more of the life of the church and exactly what it is we are doing outside of the church building.

At the beginning of last year I also introduced a new audio player for the sermons so that people have the option to play online or download. There have been multiple people ask me when the sermon will be available online, usually it is available by lunch time Monday, however if it has required a lot of editing (to correct sound quality) it can be delayed and there has been the odd occasion I have forgotten to upload the sermon from the church computer (sorry), so then it has been a case of waiting for someone to be back at church to upload it!

The new member's area was built for the purpose of; sharing CMM and AGM agenda/minutes and giving a place where any other information solely for church members can be shared privately. While these can be and have in the past been shared via email the advantage of doing it this way is that you have the ability to make comments and therefore it enables people to be able to ask questions or give feedback which the church leaders will be able to respond to. Not many people have yet to sign up for this part of the website, as it is new you will require to sign up, even if you had a login on the old website. Registration doesn't take long but you may have to wait up to 48hrs for your account to be activated as I have to manually do it.

In July I introduced a new calendar to the website, due to it having a lot more features than the old one. The new calendar can be synced to your own calendars including; Time.ly, Google, Apple Calendar and Outlook Calendar. The calendar also gives the option to share individual events via email or to a large list of social media platforms including; Facebook, Twitter, Pintrest, Linkedin, Tumblr, Messenger to name just a few.

After the Populating Heaven Seminar was recorded I was able to create a page where the audio and notes were available to listen/read and download. I have more recently contemplated on how useful it is to have resources so easily available and do hope that in future that I will have more to add and may be able to create an online training library.

**Social Media (Facebook)** – When I took over the Facebook page we had 370 page likes, this has increased to 420 likes (January 2019) which I hope means I'm getting something right! At the start I very much thought that the aim of the page was to share church news, events and maybe the odd photo here and there however the more time has progressed I have realised that Social media is a ministry in itself and that it has a much bigger purpose as God has begun to lay more and more on my heart.

In addition to the usual sharing news, events (which has been a great form of advertising) and weekly Bible mediation, from time to time I post devotionals, bible verses or videos

that I felt God was prompting me to share. I try to ensure that posts are suitable for both those viewing the page and also suitable for people to share on their own timelines, reaching out to their non-Christian friends.

On the lead up to Christmas I really felt I needed to do something to mark advent and so participated in #MyAdventChallenge which meant for 25 days I posted, a verse, picture, song, video or thought that reflected the truth of Christmas. The idea was to give food for thought to both Christians and non-Christians; some posts were more aimed as outreach where some were aimed towards Christians giving a different point of view on such a well-known story.

The start of the New Year, I shared 7 bible verses for the new year, every day for the first week along with a short devotional. Further into January I felt God prompting me to post about our Identity in Christ, I felt this was an important message to both Christians and non-Christians alike.

With Easter and Lent quickly sneaking up on us I have decided that over lent I will be sharing the 40acts (www.40acts.org.uk) generosity challenge. The idea is that Lent could is about more than just giving stuff up and could be a time of radical generosity as well as spiritual discipline. Each day there will be a new generosity challenge and short Biblebased blog straight. Each act is designed to sharpen your awareness and give you practical ways to stretch your faith as well as your generosity.

It's also worth noting that there is a Facebook feed on the website, so those without Facebook can still see what's being posted.

In the next year I can see this Social media ministry continuing to grow and perhaps more regular devotionals and food for thought, there's also the question as to whether a group page may be the way forward where perhaps members could share prayer requests among other things?

## **Technology**

Over the course of last 18 months we have seen some big changes (mainly to the bank balance).

We have bought a new pc to run the worship lyrics, video and music. This pc was specifically chosen to be future proof and can accept varied connections and I am looking into improvements to further accommodate different media used by speakers. We had a few issues when we first set up the new pc, as the old version of Easy Worship didn't work on it, so we were forced to upgrade the program used to a newer version. We had to hit the ground running when we swapped over. We have been using the new system a year now and we have now ironed out some of the issues we have been facing. We are still going through hundreds of songs to remove some where the words had not converted properly resulting in random chorus or bridge words on the screen. Thank you for not singing these.

The new pc has forced us to update the connection needed for the projector as well as I had to convert the signal to vga which was not strong enough so the picture kept cutting out during the service. A new HDMI cable has been fitted running from the back of church to the front. This has sparked a few more ideas. One being the monitor attached to the wall. As the rear projector bulb had gone and due to its age and could not be replaced, it was taken down. Also having a split screen setup at the back, which has been very useful to be able to see what is on the projector screen without the need to strain.

We have had some new speakers, which as we know severely dented the bank balance but have worked really well providing clear sound and will work very well when we move the service to the park for example. Again this hasn't been without its issues with cabling and feedback issues. Although the cables have been solved, the feedback issues have greatly improved but are still being tweaked to further improve the quality.

The idea of live streaming the service has had to stop. This is due to some people who cannot or don't want to be filmed and we cannot guarantee who would and would not be filmed, due to the size and layout of the building. Live audio is still being considered although not a lot of progress has been made to further this, due to other priorities.

The recorded services have seen some changes as well as to improve the quality of the podcasts with a better quality sound card installed.

The office pc has had an overhaul and under the new GDPR has had security measures installed with limited access and separate access for those who don't need to access the data on the machine.

We have had a lot of changes for the better with more on the way with new ideas being considered all the time. I also want to thank Steve and Heather stepping up to run the desk to allow me explore a passion in worship, playing the drums. I will continue to tweak and make changes and support the people running the tech desk and hopefully continue improving quality without any technical hiccups.
