## Secretary's Report to the AGM for 2020

The Elders have already covered the majority of the important happenings from 2020, so in light of a year that none of us would have ever expected, this will be a fairly short report.

Nicky Haylet became our only new member in 2020 taking our numbers up to 59.

This does not reflect numbers attending services, which up until lockdown was an average of 65 adults per service with the evening service attracting an average of 21 adults.

It was not long before everything changed for all of us. We were plunged into a lock down situation with the Covid-19 Pandemic. On March 17<sup>th</sup> the church leadership had an emergency meeting and on government and BUGB advice shut down all meetings at BBC. No services or prayer meetings.

People all rallied and within a week we had a new Face Book Fellowship Group and we were involved in bringing online broadcasts to the fellowship.

Hannah (Cassell) takes the majority of the credit for enabling all that to happen.

At the same time, just one week into the full lockdown and 26 days after coming home from hospital, our good friend John Daniels went to be with our Lord and Saviour. This followed a long battle with cancer, during which time John remained ever faithful, speaking to many nurses, doctors and careers about his faith.

During the first relaxation from the full lockdown we supported Future Pathways (a provider of alternative learning) by stepping in to have them use our premises as a school, having been told by the council that they could not use 'My Place'.

Despite lockdown there were still things that needed to keep going.

I cannot move on without mentioning Colin and his fabric team who have done so much work, both inside and out, during lockdown, Thanks are due to you all.

When the first lockdown was eased, protocols were put in place for some meetings to take place. That included a short run of Life Group meetings, with chairs in two distinct piles, clean and used. Unfortunately, this was short lived and instead of looking forwards to the possibility of more meetings we moved into further lockdowns. Before that happened, we did have the chance for a socially distanced Church Members Meeting where the decision to invite Joel to become our new minister was taken.

We were fortunate to obtain a Covid-19 grant from DMBC which was available to us, as renew 127 had closed but we still had to pay rent and rates on the property

The process of becoming a CIO has dragged on through the year. It was not helped initially by the lockdown and then we had to jump hurdles concerning the Baptist Pension Fund and the lease agreement we have in relation to renew 127. We pray that these matters are resolved early in 2021.

After much research, we prepared and issued a statement regarding The Passion Translation and our decision not to use this. The statement is in the member's area of the website.

During Sunday services in September and October, we explored the theme of Life-Affecting Priorities, seeing how following Jesus affected every area of our lives.

It was exciting to have a small team prepare the Christmas card sent out through Bentley New Village Primary School to every family. They were also delivered to the new-build estate on The Avenue. A big thank you to the whole team, and particularly to Hannah who set up the QR code and website link.

Sadly, John Daniels lost his fight with prostate cancer. Simon Lanelly also passed away after several weeks in hospital. Our thoughts and prayers are with Christine and Amy. It has been really difficult given we have been unable to make the personal contact normal in these circumstances.

The support across the fellowship with regular phone calls, and where allowed, meeting outside for coffee has been so encouraging. Life Groups and prayer meetings via Zoom have been a lifeline for so many - being able to see each other and talk and pray together.

Now with Joel as minister, we look forward and upward with anticipation and expectation to seeing God's Kingdom come as we seek to bless Bentley with His love and Justice.
